#### CHAMPIONSHIP

The Championship will take place after the section has finished. The **Overall Champion** will receive the **Silver Cup For Best Miniature Horse** and the **Reserve Champion** will receive The **Little Horse Trophy.** 1<sup>ST</sup> & 2<sup>ND</sup> prize winners from class MH1 – MH6 are eligible to compete for Champion & Reserve rosettes.

#### SPSBS AFFILIATION RULES 2023

Affiliated to G.E.M.S (Group established for miniature Shetlands) G.E.M.S rosettes presented to the highest placed GEMS member, wearing a 2023 GEMS badge in class SP2, SP5, SP6, SP8, SP10 and SP13.

#### SCHEDULE 2023

- 1.1 Dress must be neat, no training shoes, baseball caps or jeans. Where possible, ladies should wear a collar and tie or blouse with jacket and neat trousers or skirt/kilt. Sensible footwear is essential to allow a pony to be shown effectively. Gentlemen should wear a collar and tie and jacket with neat trousers or a suit or kilt. Hats are not compulsory for either sex but, without doubt, improve the overall picture of pony and handler (and <u>may</u> be compulsory at some Shows). There must be no individual stud, person or pony names displayed in any way in the ring e.g. on clothing, rugs, saddle cloths. Whips or show canes carried must not exceed 30" in length. Spurs may not be worn in ridden classes
- 1.2 <u>Ring Etiquette</u>: The Judge must never be spoken to using his/her name. Listen to instructions provided by the Steward or Judge and watch exhibitors in front of you. When asked to walk/trot a pony out, ensure the pony travels with you do not drag it along. When turning the pony, push it away from you do not pull it towards you. For Health & Safety and Insurance purposes a judge should ensure that all exhibitors remain standing whilst in the ring when showing ponies. KNEELING IS NOT PERMITTED. Do not ever leave the ring before the end of the class without first gaining the permission of the Judge, through the Steward. Mobile phones are not permitted under any circumstance.
- 1.3 <u>Trimming/Clipping</u>: the pony's ears may be trimmed flat but there must be no trimming inside the ear. Trimming of whiskers on the jaw line is acceptable. Sensory whiskers **MUST NOT** be trimmed. Manes and tails must not be pulled but tails may be rough trimmed to clear the ground if dragging. Leg feathers must not be trimmed. No false hair, artificial colouring or make-up should be used. Working ponies of four years old or over may be clipped on their bodies only in the interest of welfare. Under **no** circumstances should foals be clipped. Ponies should always be shown in a clean condition.
- 1.4 <u>Tack/Equipment</u>: In hand colts/stallions of two years old or over must be shown bitted and are advised to display a stallion bridle disc which are available to purchase from the SPSBS. Younger animals and older females may be shown in a suitable headcollar. For In-Hand showing, only plain, English-style jointed or straight bar snaffles are permitted. Chifney or other similar bits are not acceptable. For ridden classes, suitable bridles must be used. In the interests of safety, handlers aged 14 yrs. or under must wear a hard hat when exhibiting in In-hand classes. Hard hats, conforming to current BS standards must be worn, and correctly secured, by all ages of exhibitors in ridden classes. In lead rein classes, ponies must be shown in a suitable snaffle bridle with the reins going directly from the bit to the rider's hands. The lead rein must be attached to the nose band only.
- 1.5 <u>Registration/Eligibility</u>: at Affiliated Shows –To enter a stallion in ANY class (inhand or performance) at an affiliated show, entire males aged 4 years old and over must have an "S" number and have been successfully through either the SPSBS Stallion assessment prior to 2006 or the current SPSBS Voluntary Veterinary Examination.

Ridden stallions MUST display a stallion bridle badge. In hand colts/stallions of two years old or over must be shown bitted and are advised to display a stallion bridle disc which are available to purchase from the SPSBS. Three year old fillies with foals at foot may not be shown. Foals must be a minimum of three weeks old on the day of the Show. Colts and stallions are not permitted in Young Handlers classes. Children aged under 14 yrs. may not show colts (excluding foals) or entire males in In-hand classes. Children aged under 12 years may not show entire males in ridden classes.

Please ensure that your pony is correctly registered in your name as required by law. If the pony is on loan/lease, then that should be lodged in writing with the office.

1.6 <u>Championships</u>: where a Shetland is eligible to go forward to a Supreme Championship involving other breeds, every effort should be made to attend. This should be considered an honour and a chance to promote and bring the Shetland breed to the attention of others. If you cannot attend a Championship for which you are eligible, please ensure you advise the Show Secretary and/or Steward as soon as possible.

#### SCHEDULE 2023

- 1.7 **General**: exhibitors should be aware that a judge may not:
  - place in a class a pony which to his/her knowledge has been bred, sold, leased or produced by the judge or his/her immediate family, partner, business partner or employer.
  - place in a class a pony in which he/she has had a financial interest since 1<sup>st</sup> January of the preceding year.
  - place in a class a stallion by whom he/she has had a mare stinted in that season.
  - judge any rider/handler who has shown in a class a horse/pony owned, produced or trained by him/her since the 1<sup>st of</sup> January of the preceding year.
  - Should a situation arise when such a pony appears, a referee, preferably on the appropriate panel of judges, should be appointed by the show secretary to place the pony in question in its position in the class. If possible, a Judge may not have as their Steward any person who owns a pony, has bred a pony or has any other interest, financial or otherwise, in a pony in the class being judged.

It is recommended that exhibitors of Shetland Ponies have their own Third Party/Public Liability insurance.

- 2.1 Rules numbered 2.3 2.6 MUST be printed in your show schedule and catalogue (if one is produced).
- 2.2 If the SPS-BS panel judge has a stud name included on our judges list, then this MUST be printed beside their name in the schedule.
- 2.3 Classes must be confined to SPS-BS registered ponies. Ponies must be named on the entry form and in the catalogue if one is produced. Society rosettes must only be given to ponies registered with the Society or to foals eligible for registration.
- 2.4 Three-year-old fillies with foals at foot may not be shown. All foals must be a minimum of three weeks old on the day of the Show.
- 2.5 To enter a stallion in any class (in-hand or performance) at an affiliated show, entire males aged 4 years old and over must have an "S" number and have been successfully through either the SPSBS Stallion assessment prior to 2006 or the current SPSBS Voluntary Veterinary Examination.

Ridden stallions MUST display a stallion bridle badge. In hand colts/stallions of two years old or over must be shown bitted and are advised to display a stallion bridle disc which are available to purchase from the SPSBS.

- 2.6 There must be no colts or entire males in Young Handlers classes. Children under 14 years old may not show colts (excluding foals) or entire males in In-hand classes. Children under 12 years old on the day of the show may not show entire males in ridden classes. In the interests of safety, hard hats of the current safety standard must be worn by all handlers aged 14 years or under in In-hand classes. Exhibitors should not kneel but remain standing while in the ring. Hard hats of the current safety standard must be worn by all exhibitors, irrespective of age, in ridden classes. Ridden and driven ponies must be 4 years old or over. In ridden Classes, if a rider falls off at any time whilst in the ring, both pony and rider must leave the ring, rider dismounted, and take no further part.
- 2.7 For Health & Safety and Insurance purposes a judge should ensure that all exhibitors remain standing whilst in the ring when showing ponies. KNEELING IS NOT PERMITTED.
